








Translations & Versions of the Bible

Translation is hard work!

- Words are used differently among languages, cultures, contexts, and time.
- Not all languages have the same words.
- We want to keep the original meaning while making sure it makes sense to the reader.
- Languages use different word orders and patterns

Example: Check out p. 3

Genesis is the Bible's book of beginnings. God tells us how He created our world. He tells us about the first humans, how sin entered the world, and how He made His first promise to send His Son to save us.

He tells us about how badly people treated one another and how He decided to send a terrible flood to destroy everybody—but then saved Noah and his family by showing him how to build a great ark.

Then we read of God's plan to raise a nation of believers from an old man and his wife. By the end of the book, we see that God kept His promise by building a nation from Abraham's descendants.

WHO WROTE GENESIS?

Adam and Eve told their children what happened to them and about the promises God gave them. Their children and grandchildren carefully passed these family stories on to their children. Later, Moses wrote these stories down in the Book of Genesis.

HOW DO WE SEE GOD'S LOVE IN GENESIS?

God created a beautiful, perfect home for the first people, Adam and Eve. Even after they broke His rules, God promised to send His Son, Jesus, to save them and all of us. Over and over again, no matter how bad people get, God remembers His promise and repeats it to believers.
